



The Medieval Mind of C. S. Lewis


How Great Books Shaped a Great Mind March 15, 2022



He is the author of several books, including Created and Creating: A Biblical Theology of Culture; Reasons of the Heart: Recovering Christian Persuasion; Does Christianity Really Work?; The Christian Mind: Escaping Futility; A Transforming Vision: The Lord's Prayer as a Lens for Life; Francis Schaeffer on the Christian Life; and Christian Apologetics Past and Present.



Amy Sherman offers a multifaceted, biblically grounded framework for enacting God's call to seek the shalom of our communities in six arenas of civilizational life (The Good, The True, The Beautiful, The Just, The Prosperous, and The Sustainable). She said, "This approach argues that these six social realms must be healthy and strong if a community is to flourish. I couple this sociological framework with theological reflection on God's normative intentions for each realm and what scripture teaches about how these arenas have been malformed by the fall. I then discuss specific historical and contemporary strategies that the Church has implemented to re-form these spheres and strengthen them. My hope is that these stories will both inspire and instruct today's Christian leaders."


